As part of our Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE) curriculum, and in line with our Relationship, Health and Sex Education (RSE) policy, class teachers will be delivering a series of lessons in the Summer Term. These will cover a range of topics through the Cambridgeshire Primary Personal Development Programme. We feel that this scheme of work has been carefully designed taking into consideration age-appropriate materials which are well matched to meet the needs of our pupils at Oakington C of E Primary School. This curriculum incorporates the Relationships Education and Health Education guidance, whilst also supporting the Science National Curriculum. The sessions will be conducted in a safe, trusting and secure environment.

Please see below the overview for each lesson:

Learning Objectives	Vocabulary
To know that humans produce babies that grow into children and then into adults.	Similarities and differences between humans and animals babies, toddler, child, teenager, adult
To understand that babies grow inside a female body until they are ready to be born.	Pregnancy
To consider the ways they have changed physically, socially and emotionally since they were born.	Changes as we get older: e.g. legs and arms grow longer, our hair grows thicker and changes colour, our milk teeth fall out
To consider their responsibilities now and compare these with when they were younger.	What can you do now that you couldn't do when you were a baby?
To understand how the needs of babies and young children are met by their families.	What does a baby need in order to be happy / safe?
To understand that not all families are the same, but that love and care should be at the heart of all families.	All of the above.
